

## Fillet Sticks and Chisel Sticks

Measure and mark your sticks.

Fillet sticks work much better when the **edges are thin and sharp**.

The ends can be beveled down to the last layer of veneer with a sanding block.

Use very fine sandpaper to clean up the tips.



**Two chisel sticks**, named such because they are sharpened like a chisel (and get shorter every time they are sharpened) are shown in the previous photo. **These work like magic for cleaning up epoxy and save countless hours of sanding**, but they must be sharp to work well. Chisel sticks can be made from tongue depressor sticks (should be thin, light & flexible).

Both ends are sharpened, but done so on opposite sides for cleaning both ways.

A sanding block with really fine paper works well for sharpening these important tools. A burr will develop when sharpening, fold the burr over with your finger and make one last pass on the sanding block.
